**Mayor Amato** would like residents to know the Township participates in the Ocean County Paint Management Program and the Household Hazardous Waste Disposal Program. Full, partially full and empty paint cans are accepted at:

Berkeley Township recycling center, 360 Pinewald-Keswick Road, Across from Berkeley Township Police Headquarters.

The limit is 20 paint cans per day.

The program is for **BERKELEY TOWNSHIP residents and taxpayers ONLY.** Paint will not be accepted from businesses such as paint contractors.

Recycling Center is Open Monday through Saturday 8:00 A.M. - 2:00 P.M.

This program is for latex, oil based and boat paints only, NO stains, varnishes, polyurethanes or wood preservatives.

## State of New Jersey Unclaimed Property Mayor Amato Urges Residents to Check for Unclaimed Property

Mayor Amato would like residents to be aware they may have unclaimed property they may be entitled to and don't know it. The State of New Jersey Unclaimed Property Administration has partnered with other states in an attempt to get unclaimed money back to them or family members. Common types of unclaimed property include: Bank accounts and safe deposit box contents; Stocks, mutual funds, bonds, and dividends; Uncashed checks and wages; Insurance policies, CD's, trust fund; Utility deposits escrow accounts. "This is a free service and worth a few minutes to check to see if you or a family member maybe entitled to unclaimed property."
